"Hike All of Glacier in an Hour (or so)" with Jake Bramante of Hike 734 at the Montana House June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2014

He concludes his presentation with lessons he learned with applications both practical and inspiring for anyone who needs encouragement to start a challenging endeavor or find the strength to finish. Jake will also speak about his newly published Day Hikes of Glacier National Park Map Guide.

Jake grew up in northwest Montana. After graduating high school from Bigfork and attending college in Arizona he returned to Montana with a degree in Computer Information Systems and a renewed desire to explore the amazing country he grew up in. He began exploring the Bob Marshall Wilderness complex and Glacier National Park. In 2010, he walked away from his corporate job as an IT professional to pursue film and video production. Soon a project developed which became 'Hike 734' – hike all 734 miles of trail in Glacier National Park in one year and film his endeavor. Jake is an engaging speaker and thoroughly enjoys sharing his hiking experiences.

The presentation at the Montana House will begin at 7 pm with time for questions and a reception to follow.
