"Backcountry - a Novel" A Talk and Book Signing by James W. Clarke at the Montana House

The Montana House and the Glacier National Park Conservancy are pleased to co-host another in the series of "Look, Listen & Learn" programs at the Montana House in Apgar Village inside Glacier National Park. The featured author, James W. Clarke, is from West Glacier, Montana and Tucson, Arizona. His presentation will be at 7:00 p.m. Saturday evening, July 13, 2013.

Clarke is University Distinguished Professor Emeritus at the University of Arizona, former Fulbright Scholar, and occasional consultant to the U.S. Secret Service. He is the author of a number of articles that have appeared in leading academic journals, and five nonfiction books on violent crime.

Backcountry: A **Novel** is his first fictional book – a thriller story of love, murder, and high adventure set in Montana's Glacier National Park. With his expertise of the criminal mind, extensive knowledge of the Crown of the Continent, and insight into Native American Indian traditions and beliefs, the book is a combination of outdoor adventure and high stakes suspense.
